GENERAL INFORMATION

- The course will be held at an advanced level. It is open to ECSRHM residents, who have priority for attendance, and to veterinarians with some experience in working with small ruminants (at least 2 years' work).

Registration

- For registration: (a) ECSRHM residents should mention surname, training centre and supervisor (b) non-ECSRHM residents should mention surname and professional background in brief.
- After acceptance of registration, payment of appropriate sum should be carried out as below and proof of payment of the relevant sum (bank transfer slip) should be sent as above.
- Cost for ECSRHM residents is 60 €.
- Registration fee for non-ECSRHM residents is 360 €.

Venue

- The course will take place at the Department of Obstetrics and Reproduction of the Veterinary Faculty of the University of Thessaly. The Faculty is located in the town of Karditsa, in Central Greece, 310 km from Athens or 210 km from Thessaloniki.
- Lectures will take place at the Veterinary Faculty. Practical courses will be held in the Faculty and in dairy sheep farms in the area. Transport will be provided for the visits.

Travel to Karditsa

- The most conveniently located airports are in Athens and Thessaloniki.
- From Athens airport, one can take Airport Express bus no. X93 (45 min., $7 ext{ €}$) or a taxi (30 min., $35 ext{ €}$) to KTEL station Liosion bus stop; thence, buses to Karditsa depart at 07.30, 10.30 13.30, 15.30, 18.00, 21.00 (4.5 h., $30 ext{ €}$) daily.
- From Thessaloniki airport, one can take a taxi (30 min, 25 €) to Thessaloniki KTEL station; thence, buses to Karditsa depart at 10.00, 15.00, 19.00 (3.5 h., 25 €) daily.
- Taxis are available at the Karditsa bus station for transfer to hotel (5 min., 7 €).

Accommodation in Karditsa

- Following hotels provide accommodation in Karditsa town centre: Astron, Arni, Avra, Kierion. Early booking, directly with the hotel, should be arranged.
- Transfer from hotel to the Faculty can be made by taxi (7 min.; 7 €).

Course program

- Small scale changes may be made in the program, according to availability of lecturers. Final program will be published by end of February 2019.
- Biosecurity material (gloves, single use plastic boots, single use overalls) during work with animals and farm visits will be provided.
- Certificates of attendance will be provided to delegates at the end of the course.

Catering
