About me

- At the time of the Alternative Training Programme I was in private, mixed practice in central Italy, with a solid caseload of predominantly dairy sheep. I was my own boss. Assisted by other staff, I did run a fairly complex operation.
- I had forged links with the University of Padua Vet School and with the Istituto Zooprofilattico Umbria e Marche, sezione di Perugia (state lab with an excellent case load of small ruminants diagnostics).
- My Supervisor was Prof. G. Fhtenakis (Thessaly University, Greece).
- So my perception is biased towards the clinical practice, but your path might be coming from pathology, or clinical pathology, or reproduction, or something else. Provided that you have a degree of exposure to everything else, you will be fine

About you. These are the requirements. Can you match the expectations?

- You will have to formally enrol in the training programme, so you need to find a Supervisor and an accredited training centre. Check the ECSRHM website:

Log book of clinical cases

- This is a reflection of your work. To start the training you have to have a good caseload. It could be in a consolidating/expanding phase, but it has to be solid from the start
- Remember to take notes of individual and flock-based cases as they happen, and transfer them to your spreadsheet asap. It is otherwise tedious to catch up with it later on!

Research and publications

- Exposure to clinical cases leads to research ideas. Take a note when that happens!
- Your Supervisor is most likely University-based, or with close links to. He/she will be able to help to develop and implement research ideas
- It seems to me that the requirements in terms of publications are well manageable when spread over the time of an Alternative training programme

Case reports

- Only five of them!
- While recording cases for the logbook, highlights the ones of particular interest, adding more details. Ideally, write a quick draft with the main points
- Remember, you have to find a balance between individual- and flockbased cases
- Again, a very doable exercise in relation to the time allocate

Training in different disciplines

- Develop a plan with your Supervisor, as to where, and doing what.
- You will need to allocate time off and some funding
- This is a truly exciting area of activities. Most likely you will be travelling abroad to learn, and is so much fun!
